"The Gothic exterior was maintained while the interior -- which lacked

technical challenges with walls of hollow clay brick, making it impossible to disturb the structure with any perforations. For this reason the electrical in the rooms was run through a wire mold at the base with cleverly disguised surface run wiring.
